

State	Hours of Operation
Illinois	Most overweight only loads – 24/7 Most overdimension loads – M-F ½ hour prior to sunrise to ½ hour after sunset; Sat – ½ hour prior to sunrise to noon. Overdimension loads up to 12 wide, 13-6 high, 115 long may move additionally on Saturdays to ½ hour after sunset and Sundays 1/2 hour before sunrise to noon.
Indiana	Up to 110' long, 10' wide, legal height, and/or overweight only 24/7. Over 110' long 10'-14'4" wide, up to 15' high 7 Days a week 1/2 hr before sunrise to 1/2 hr after sunset. Between 14'4 -16' wide Monday -Friday 1/2 hr before sunrise to 1/2 hr after sunset. Permitted mobile home and manufactured buildings between 8'6" -14'4" wide Monday -Friday 1/2 hr before sunrise to 1/2 hr after sunset and Saturday 1/2 hr before sunrise to noon.
Iowa	Continuous movement allowed if Width does not exceed 11 feet, Height does not exceed 14 feet 4 inches, Length does not exceed 100 feet, and/or Weight - Permitted axle limits. Anything outside the listed dimensions can only operate 1/2 hour before sunrise until 1/2 hour after sunset.
Kentucky	24-7 travel with the following exceptions: No travel in Boone, Campbell, Jefferson (Louisville), Fayette (Lexington), and Kenton Counties, and the 431 bridge in Owensboro between 7 a.m. and 9 a.m. and from 4 p.m. to 6 p.m. Monday through Friday
Michigan	24/7 if you are overweight only (legal size). If you are within the limits of 10' in width, 14' in height and 90' in overall length you can haul 7 days a week during daylight hours only, beginning 1/2 hour before sunrise and ending 1/2 hour after sunset. If you are beyond those limits you can haul 5 days a week between the same daylight hour limits specified above. We also have curfew hours for our 11 highest population counties. In those counties you are not allowed to travel between the hours of 7 and 9 AM or 3 and 6 PM.

Minnesota	<p>24/7 movement for overweight (possible exception for mega-heavy that would severely disrupt traffic). Less than 9' wide, 14' high, 75' long combination (single motor vehicle 45' long, mobile crane 48' long), including if overweight, allowed 24/7 travel. All other loads may travel 2AM to 10PM daily, except for special restrictions (Twin Cities and Duluth Rush Hour restrictions, Summer restriction-no move after 2PM on Friday's and Sunday's, and Holiday restrictions).</p>
Missouri	<p>Overweight only 24/7. Loads less than 14' wide 1/2 hour before sunrise until 1/2 hour past sunset 7 days aweek. All other loads 1/2 hour before sunrise until 1/2 hour past sunset. No movement during curfew hours or on Holidays. Hours determined by State Police for loads they escort.</p>
Wisconsin	<p>24/7 movement for overweight only - (possible exception to this if load is mega-heavy - upwards of 350,000 lbs gvw or on a route with many slow to crawl speed to minimize bridge impact). Vehicles that are legal height (13'06"), no longer than 100' long, nor wider than 12' may operate during hours of darkness and the weekends. However, vehicles of this size may not operate from 4 p.m. to 11 p.m. on Fridays all year long, and from Memorial Day through Labor Day they are also restricted during those hours on Sunday. Vehicles that are over legal height, longer than 100' long and wider than 12' have the above limitations and other hours - typically more restrictive - depending on dimensions, route and load type. Typical restrictions for these larger loads are: No operation during hours of darkness; No operation after Noon on Saturday; no operation on Sunday. However, these are the loads that we may condition somewhat counter-intuitively - e.g. we will specify that a super-wide load originating in Milwaukee must travel late at night.
